Proposed trips for 1956 are as follows and we will try to fit in as many of the below mentioned places as possible - think them over and let us know your preferences:

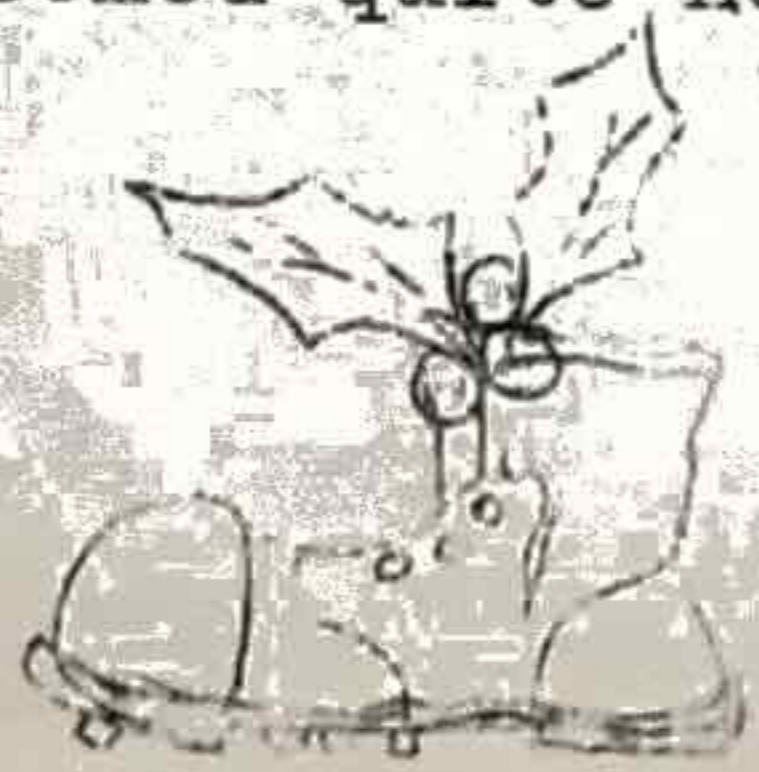
Albert River : Mt. Edwards : Barney Spur - Ballow throughwalk.
