Freshers' Trip (6-7th March)

Grace's Hut and Upper Portals (Leader: Barry Baker)

This walk has been designed specifically to introduce freshers and fresherettes to the pleasures of a weekend with the club out in the bush; so come along and discover for yourself an area of rushing waters and craggy peaks. You can rest assurred that this will not be a strenuous trip, as most old members are decidedly out of condition at present.

Transport will leave from the Kidney Lawn in the George St. Universtiy grounds at 8.00 a.m., Saturday 6th March. After driving through Beaudesert and Rathdowney we hope to reach Grace's Hut, at the northern foot of the main mass of Mt. Barney.

That afternoon will be spent swimming amo ngst mountain nymphs in pools near the Upper Portals; - a rugged area where the waters of Barney Ck. have cut a gorge in solid rock. This is only a short walk away from our basecamp at Grace's Hut. Be sure to bring plenty of swimming equipment.

On the following day we intend to climb to Montserrat Lookout, where a spectacular view can be obtained of the peaks and crags of Mr. Barney, Mt. Ballow and Mt. Maroon.

We hope to be able to take some transport right to the basecamp, so gear need not be carried far.

Throakban, and Buchannan's Fort.
