26th - 28th June.....Mt. Ballow, Upper Portals.

This will be a throughwalk near Mt. Barney, as follows:

Friday night: A seven mile walk along level country to Grace's hut.

Saturday: Climb Mt. Ballow (without packs) and descend over Montserrat Lookout to the Upper Portals. Mt. Ballow can be bypassed by those not feeling energetic.

Sunday: Return over Mt. May.

This is an excellent trip. With Mt. Ballow it is fairly strenuous and without Mt. Ballow it is average.
