Starting at the freeway end of the cliff.

- Keep The Wasp Off The Tiger (19) 10m. Begin below the overhang and overcome it. Toproped by John Jones and Michael Woodrow, December, 1984.
- Short Wall Right-Hand Variant (16) 10m. Trend right just past half height. Toproped by Evan Bieske, 1981.
- Short Wall (16) 10m. Nearly as bad as it looks. Short, dirty and loose: try something else unless you've done them all. Toproped by Ron Masters, 1977.
- ? Cox's Edge \* (13) 16m. Joy for novices. Climb the series of ledges tending slightly left. Step up right onto a ledge at the bottom of a corner. Climb into the corner then pull around right (crux), then up. Led by persons unknown in the mid-sixties.
- Rankin's Rape (15) 4m. An easy boulder problem. Soloed by Rob Rankin, 1972.
- Files \*\*\* (23) 17m. Boulder problem start, boulder problem middle, boulder problem end. A great climb that is more exciting than a lot of nonurban classics, although a little discontinuous. Start two meters right of Cox's Overhang by pulling up on a slope (first soloed by Robbie Allen, 1982). Wander up right then left to a fixed bracket. Go left then up right past another bolt. Dynoing is possibly useful here. Up the slab and shallow corner clipping the antique (cosmetic?) things. If you're leading, try not to fall. Toproped by Paul Hoskins and Andrew Barry, 1983. Led by Paul Hoskins, 1983.
- ? Cox's Diagonal (14) 8m. Left to right to join Cox's Edge. Led by persons unknown in the mid-sixties.
- Cox's Overhang \*\*\* (17) 17m. The definition of classic. Start up the shallow corner and slither up the right side of the smooth black slab using a slot and some edges on the right. Easily up to the overhang which is passed by pulling up and around to the right. Now the holds shrink to almost nothing as you shake your way up the face just to the right of the blunt arête. Aided by Ron Cox, 1959. Led by Ted Cais, 1968.
- Fingerpop (18) 6m. Once upon a time boulder problems like this were called climbs. Toproped by Rob Rankin, 1972. Soloed by Andrew Barry, 1982.
- ? Pseudo-Cox's (11) 17m. A ramble containing one interesting move. Led by persons unknown in the mid-sixties.
- ? Cox's Corner (8) 16m. Abysmal. Led by persons unknown in the mid-sixties.
- Hernia (12) 14m. Its not really that strenuous. The start is a good place to learn or practice the arts of laybacking and handjamming. Led by Rob

Rankin, 1972.

- White Dopes On Punk (20) 13m. Now a reasonably worthwhile climb due to the addition of a leftwards traverse after the crux, culminating in a frog fornicating mantle onto the Arête ledge. Finish up that climb. Toproped by Darren Holloway and Michael Woodrow, December, 1984. Led by Andrew Barry, December, 1984.
- Arête (12) 13m. There are worse routes. Toproped by Rob Rankin, 1972. Soloed by Andrew Barry, 1981.
- Slippery Dip (10) 14m. The ugly, vegetated, left-leaning ramp. Soloed by Rick White, 1968.
- Responding To Purely Rabbitoid Stimuli (17) 13m. Three meters right of Dickillo is a blankish wall. The climb leans right and finishes up the right-hand corner. Toproped by Mick Woodrow, Darren Holloway and John Jones, December, 1984. Led by Mick Woodrow and Moira Blom, January, 1985.
- Responding To Purely Rabbitoid Stimuli Variant Finish (20) 13m. Finishes up Piccolo. Toproped by Mick Woodrow, Darren Holloway and John Jones, December, 1984.
- Piccolo (A2) 13m. Bathook up drilled holes just right of the bolts. Aided by Ted Cais, 1969.
- Dickillo (A1) 13m. Aid up the bolts. Aided by Rick White and Ron Collett, 1969.
- Nic Pics Dics (23) 13m. A hopelessly contrived activity. Use the Dickillo bolts for protection as you struggle to avoid the inviting holds on Gigolo. Continue to eschew them until the last (fifth) bolt is clipped, then crank up and left for a jug. Finally allow yourself to use some large holds and wonder why you bothered. Led by Andrew Barry, February, 1985.
- Cockillo (A2) 13m. Climb Gigolo using aid only. Aided by John Pickard, 1969.
- Gigolo \*\* (17) 13m. Excitingly short. Up the strange series of overhangs doing funny moves with underclings. Toproped by Ted Cais, 1969. Led by Evan Bieske and Roger Bourne, February, 1985.
- Steaming Wally (26) 13m. The blunt arête provides some very technical maneuvers, gradually increasing in difficulty until the final crack is reached. Led by Paul Hoskins, February, 1985.
- Courtesan (A1) 13m. Awaits a competent leader. Aided by John Pickard and Dennis Stocks, 1969.
- Wrinkled Welsh Weenies (8) 13m. Up the block right of the prominent bulge. Toproped by Eddie Irvine, December, 1984. Soloed by Mick "Mad Bolter" Woodrow, May, 1985.
- Crud Corner (8) 15m. Exquisite. Wander up the wide corner and ledges. Soloed by Rick White, 1968.
- Pig City \*\* (24) 17m. Start below the fat bolt. Use your reach else somehow barndoor then somehow jump or slap for a something edge; all in all, its somewhat tricky. Feed your fingers to the piranah and crank up to a jug beside the peg. Pull easily up and over the next barrier then before you know it, you're in Leopard St. Toproped by Roger Bourne, 1984. Led by Roger Bourne, 1984.
- Adam's Rib Direct \*(18) 17m. Don't deviate from the vertical. Toproped by Evan Bieske and Bill Haseler, 1980. Led by Richard Henderson, April 1985.
- Adam's Rib \* (14) 17m. Feet can be helpful. Go to the crack in the wall and out to the right of the overhang where you can rest on a large ledge. Your goal is the chair-size ledge three meters left. Swing across on your arms, using feet where possible, until you reach something that is pleasant to fondle. Wrench on this until you can worm your way onto the throne and repose in the attitude of a queen. Zoom up in regal fashion to the corner four meters above. Step right onto the arête where good ledges lead to the top. Led by Rick White and Ted Cais, 1968.

- Gobble \* (22) 18m. Up the corner to the *Adam's Rib* ledge then diagonally up left past a bolt to some pegs. Lay back on hammered-in digits to reach some jugs above and right. Pull up to a surprise. Toproped by Chris Piesker and Coral Bowman, October, 1977. Led by Paul Hoskins, 1983.
- Scragged Solid \* (20) 18m. Start at a bolt under a slight overhang. Climb the overhangs and ledges to attain some succulent bolts and the start of the fingery, bulging headwall traverse. To the arête and up. Might take a direct finish. Toproped by Rob Staszewski, 1975. Led by Tony Young, 1983.
- By Ignorance Direct (17) 18m. Direct to the right side of the top slab. Soloed by Andrew Barry, 1982.
- By Ignorance Direct Finish (12) 18m. Traverse to the right of the top slab. Led by Rick White and Chris Meadows, 1968.
- By Ignorance \* (12) 18m. An enlivening introductory route. Led by Rick White and Chris Meadows, 1968.
- Bufo Marinus \* (21) 5m. Boulder out the wall right of *Moonlight Fantasia*. Soloed by Roger Bourne, 1984.
- Bufo Marinus Direct \* (21) 9m. Instead of going right to the arête, step left and continue up to the big ledge. Anyone for soloing it? Toproped by Andrew Barry, Gordon Bieske and Rob Stewart, January, 1985.
- Moonlight Fantasia Right-Hand Variant \* (17) 8m. Over the roof then continue to the second ledge. Toproped by Roger Bourne and Rick White, 1979.
- Moonlight Fantasia \* (18) 18m. A fun lead. This technical excursion wears out hoards of muscle-bound grunters. Led by Paul Caffyn and Rick White, 1968.
- Be A Robot For Jesus \*\*\*\* (25) 18m. Pumpy and technical. Toproped by Jeff Lamb, 1983. Led by Andrew Barry, November, 1984.
- Cucumber Castle \*\*\*\* (23) 18m. Cranking on a steep diagonal line. After a stunning array of hard moves you might finally arrive at the top. Aided by Rob Staszewski, 1974. Toproped by Jeff Lamb, 1983. Led by Andrew Barry and Paul Hoskins, November, 1984.
- Wages Of Fear \*\*\*\* (24) 18m. Sustained and painful. Like its neighbour, *Cucumber Castle*, this one is another desperate fight all the way. Aided by John Pickard, 1968. Toproped by Chris Piesker and Coral Bowman, October, 1977. Led by Roger Bourne, November, 1984.
- Honed And Buffed \* (24) 17m. You certainly are if you can get up this. At the horizontal break move up and left. Toproped by Paul Hoskins, 1982. Led by Andrew Barry, December, 1984.
- Heap Of Shit (20) 17m. Mediocre. A peg, (hopefully permanent) in down low makes for a varied lead just to the right of *Pterodactyl*. Toproped by Henry Barber, 1975. Led by Mick Woodrow and Darren Holloway, August, 1985.
- Pterodactyl (18) 17m. Dinosaurs only. Led by Ted Cais and Dave Reeve, 1969.
- Pterodactyl Direct \* (17) 18m. Popular. Led by Rick White, 1969.
- Euthanasia \*\* (20) 17m. The crux is at the roof. There is now a bolt at the roof, so lead it. Aided by Greg Sheard and Dennis Stocks, 1969. Toproped by Chris Piesker and Coral Bowman, October, 1977. Led by Paul Hoskins and Dave Moss, 1982.
- Bloody Oath Variant Start (17) 6m. Takes the roof to the right of *Bloody Oath*. Toproped by Andrew Barry and Evan Bieske, 1982. Soloed by Gordon Bieske, 1984.
- Stoat Clips Bolts (18) 18m. The obvious continuation of the previous route. Once past the roof continue at the left side of the smooth wall. Led by Gordon Bieske and Rob Whannell, March, 1985.
- Bloody Oath \*\* (16) 18m. Mate. Led by Rick White and Chris Meadows, 1968.
- Anonymous Arête (19) 18m. Its not even contrived. Toproped by Andrew Barry, 1982.
- Fantastic (18) 5m. Really just a variant start to *Anonymous Arête*. Toproped by Bruce Stoff, 1983. Soloed by Gordon Bieske, 1984.

- Anonymous (14) 18m. Some soloists find this difficult to retreat off. Led by Dave Reeve, 1968.
- XXX (25) 18m. A reach problem so subtract several grades if you do it easily. Otherwise dyno, with difficulty, a long way for a good hold. Toproped by Chris Piesker and Coral Bowman, October, 1977. Led by Chris Frost, January, 1985.
- Brisbane Bitter \*\*\*\* (25) 18m. Partake in magnificent adventure on this bold lead. Toproped by Chris Piesker and Coral Bowman, October, 1977. Led by Paul Hoskins, 1983.
- Hanger Wall (A1) 18m. The free part, up to the diagonal, makes a fine start to Brisbane Bitter. Aided by Ted Cais, 1968.
- Gangbang Wall Variant Start \*\* (24) 8m. Have turns on the smooth left side of the slab. Toproped by Paul Hoskins, 1982.
- Gangbang Wall \* (23) 18m. A delightful experience with potential for a large lead fall. Toproped by Paul Hoskins, 1981. Led by Andrew Barry and Roger Bourne, November, 1984.
- Hanger Wall Arête \* (19) 18m. Amusing. Climb the easy blocky arête to a ledge below an absence-of-jugs. Pull up onto the sloping triangular ledge. Go around to the right of the overhang and up the wall above. This cliff once had a reputation for producing leads which contained the odd difficult move above in situ, or much worse, leader-placed runners. However, even the urban sleaze-pit of ethics which is Kangaroo Point has sunk to a new low with the lead of this route. There's enough superfluous bolts to outfit a hardware shop. Unfortunately, the new wave of white dopes barely tower over ankle height. Toproped by Rick White, 1971. Led by Michael Woodrow, February, 1985.
- Exhilarant \*\*\*\* (16) 18m. Yes. Climb the easy corner keeping to the right. Get into the groove below the large slab in the corner, onto the slab then stretch for some good buckets on the left. Cut loose on these and swing up. Be prepared for some more difficult moves before topping-out. Toproped by Greg Sheard and Rick White, 1968. Led by Rick White, 1969.
- The Bridal Party (19) 18m. Start below the bolt. Go up and left to another bolt. Continue past it to a ledge. Hand traverse right to the Exhilarant ledge then straight up past two more good rests and top out on the final slab. Watch the rope drag. Toproped by Rob Whannell and Gordon Bieske, January, 1985. Led by Rob and Catherine Whannell, February, 1985.
- Dysentery Direct Start (17) 6m. Climb the drill-hole on the right. Soloed by Fred From, 1980.
- Dysentery \* (17) 18m. Doodle up to a stance near a bolt at six metres. Now move diagonally right for two metres, then back left and up. Toproped by Greg Sheard, 1968. Soloed by Gordon Bieske, 1984.
- Dysentery Direct Finish \*\* (19) 18m. Go over the roof. Toproped by Ted Cais and Rick White, 1969. Led by Rob Whannell, February, 1985.
- Nic Chips Diffs (24) 18m. The test of crank. Led by Kim Carrigan, December, 1983.
- 42 Wheels (25) 18m. Tackle the blunt arete just right of Another Girl Another Planet. Toproped by Michael Woodrow and Darren Holloway, May, 1985.
- Another Girl, Another Planet \*\* (21) 18m. Start two meters right of the usual launchpad and continue to the slab. Toproped by Darren Holloway and Michael Woodrow, November, 1984. Led by Michael Woodrow and Eddie Irvine, February, 1985.
- Mission Impossible Right-Hand Variant \*\* (19) 18m. Go right onto the slab. Toproped by Ted Cais, 1969. Soloed by Mick Woodrow, March, 1985.
- Mission Impossible (17) 18m. Follow the line, keeping to left of the slab. Led by Rick White and Ted Cais, 1969.
- Socket It Unto Me \* (18) 18m. Don't step left at eight meters and don't go left approaching the top. Toproped by Ted Cais and Rick White, 1969. Led

- by Michael Woodrow and Moira Blom, February, 1985.
- Socket It Unto Me Variant (18) 18m. Step left, just before the crux, at about eight meters. Toproped by Andrew Barry, 1981.
- Socket It Unto Me, Left-Hand Variant (19) 18m. Go left and up for the last three meters. Toproped by Ted Cais and Rick White, 1969.
- The Stoats' Stepped Out \* (18) 18m. A little serious for the grade. Start two metres left of the Socket start. Climb directly upwards to rest on the prominent block at fifteen metres. Tackle the headwall two metres right of the Idiot Wind finish to end. Toproped by Michael Woodrow and Darren Holloway, February 1985. Led by Darren Holloway and Michael Woodrow, April 1985.
- Sounds Of Silence \*\* (22) 88m. A six pitch traverse towards the right.
- Pitch 1: (17) 21m. Up Idiot Wind to the small roof at half height. Trend downwards to belay below the crux of Nic Chips Diffs. Led by Andrew Barry and Gordon Bieske, 1983.
- Pitch 2: (16) 9m. Go slightly up then swing across Exhilarant and step down to belay. Led by Andrew Barry and Gordon Bieske, 1983.
- Pitch 3: \*(20) 11m. The original Sounds of Silence traverse. Also an exciting and worthwhile single pitch with moderate protection. Best belayed at the ledge at eight metres. Aided by Rob Rankin and Rob Simcocks, 1972. Led by Nic Taylor, Paul Hoskins and Dave Moss, 1983.
- Pitch 4: (17) 13m. To the ledge half way up Pterodactyl. Led by Paul Hoskins and Nic Taylor, 1983.
- Pitch 5: \*\*(22) 14m. Follow the break to the high ledge on Moonlight Fantasia. Led by Andrew Barry and Roger Bourne, 1983.
- Pitch 6: (22) 20m. Continue to Adam's Rib and finish up it. Led by Andrew Barry and Gordon Bieske, 1983.
- Idiot Wind \*\* (21) 18m. An especially good lead. Go up to mantle onto the top of the slightly overhanging wall. Up some ledges to the square overhang with a bolt. Delicately move slightly right and up to the bottom of the intimidating headwall. Clip another bolt on the right then shinny and lunge up the flake to its top and, happily, another bolt. Stand on tippy toes to reach some good holds which, if used correctly, will lead to the summit picnics. Otherwise, plummet off. Toproped by John Hattink, 1975. Led by Gordon Bieske and Paul Hoskins, 1984.
- Idiot Wind Variant Start (21) 5m. A boulder problem that makes the bottom worthwhile as well. Soloed by Andrew Barry, 1983.
- Tombstone Row \* (15) 18m. Difficult onto the ledge. Led by Dave Reeve, 1968.
- Bombadil (15) 18m. Straight up to the smooth wall at twelve meters. Go left of this to the overhang at the top. Toproped by Rob Brodribb and John Webb, 1975.
- Kaspar (16) 18m. Straight up to underneath the bulging overhang. Traverse right, around the overhang (crux), then traverse left across the sloping ledge above the overhang and direct to the top. Toproped by John Webb and Rob Brodribb, 1975.
- The Exterminator \*\* (21) 6m. For heroes only. An amusing boulder problem that inevitably grew into a terrifying ogre. After a difficult heel-hooking start (the original mild-mannered problem, courtesy of Evan Bieske, 1982), keep climbing the thin, creaking flake to some very high jugs. Soloed by Roger Bourne, 1984.
- The Rasp (15) 12m. The trash on top of The Exterminator. Toproped by Mick Johnston, 1984.
- Pommy Bastard (21) 18m. Desperate in sandshoes. Toproped by Eggi Everitt and John Hattink, 1977.
- ? → Tuesday Afternoon Walk (16) 18m. Once known to be loose but is now reputed to be a great climb. Several encounters of the bulging kind. Toproped by

persons unknown in 1980.

- Blue-Veined Custard Shooter (20) 18m. The crackline to half height then direct to the top. Toproped by Gordon Bieske and Dave Moss, 1984.
- A R R O W (19) 18'M. Miserable. Toproped by Ron Masters, 1977.
- Froth (22) 18m. The overhang will slow you down. Toproped by Fred From, 1976.
- Froth Variant (23) 18m. A reasonably direct line to the overhang left of Froth. Start at 45A. Toproped by Ron Masters, September, 1985.
- Lost In Space (17) 18m. An obvious crackline. Straight up and into top "V" below the overhang (crux), then go right to loose rocks. Toproped by John Jones and Tony Howes, June, 1980.
- Ring Around The Moon (16) 18m. Straight up to a large overhanging block. Ascend its left side using a hold under the block. Next, a couple of tricky moves to a good jug. Onwards to the next overhang with loose rock. Pass this barrier using the more solid holds then direct to the top. Best climbed at night. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, June, 1980.
- Smog (14) 18m. Clean as you climb. Be wary of the left side of the dish. A mixture of smoke and fog makes this climb \_\_\_! Toproped by Tony Howes and Bernie Corfield, May, 1980.
- David Mac (15) 18m. Meander up broken rock. A good Sunday jaunt named after a Morman killed on Crookneck. First climbed as his funeral was going on at the church opposite the climb. Toproped by John Jones and Tony Howes, May, 1980.
- Slime Fresh (16) 18m. A crack to the tree then mark for the rest. Toproped by Tony Howes and Bernie Corfield, July, 1980. Led by Eddie Irvine and Jonathon Dwyer, February, 1985.
- Bottle Stopper (14) 18m. Another crack jetting through grossness. Toproped by John Jones and Bernie Corfield, June, 1980.
- Gungle Gim Right-Hand Start (12) 18m. Right of the initials start at the square. Toproped by Greg Williamson and Bernie Corfield, March, 1980.
- Gungle Gim (14) 18m. Start at the square mark left of the initials. Good climbing and balancy moves. Toproped by John Jones, 1980.
- Insomnia (15) 18m. An unappetising and fingery undertaking. Up the wall to a small overhang, and good jugs if you can reach them. Toproped by Tony Howes and John Jones, July, 1980.
- Razor (16) 18m. More of the same. Hard layback on the obvious block. Pass the summit bulges and get itchy in the weeds. Toproped by Tony Howes and Bernie Corfield, June, 1980.
- ? → Crap (16) 18m. Follow clumps of grass to a steep headwall. Toproped by Rick White, 1969.
- Wind In The Willows (16) 18m. Rat said "Not today, I don't want to give you pain.....". Great moves. Toproped by John Jones and Bernie Corfield, June, 1980.
- Tiger Stripe (15) 18m. Improved rock and climbing, except for the finale. Follow the stripe a third of the way; left to the stripe again at the top. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, April, 1980.
- Salt Sity Waltz (15) 18m. Good for ten meters. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, July, 1980.
- Kiwi (18) 18m. A shallow groove to start, then ledges and the usual bulge. Toproped by Tony Howes, April, 1980.
- Halva (14) 18m. Recommended. Fun moves up the top on good rock. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, April, 1980.
- Radioactive Cheerio (15) 18m. Strenuous before the seemingly inevitable deterioration. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and Tony Howes, April, 1980.
- Vegetite (17) 18m. The Australian legend. Getting onto the rock is more difficult than the climbing. Beware of the spikes. Toproped by Tony Howes, Bernie Corfield and John Jones, July, 1980.

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- ? → Mank Mistress (18) 18m. Follow the broken seam, then grassy to the top. Toproped by Rick White, 1969.
- Nightfell Direct (21) 18m. Force (reach helps) the overhung section. Toproped by Evan Bieske and Andrew Barry, 1982.
- Wounded Knee (18) 18m. Excellent, one of the best in the area. Now has three bolts. Perhaps a little scary to lead. Toproped by John Jones and Bernie Corfield, June, 1980. Led by Rob Whannell, August, 1985.
- Keyhole (18) 18m. Start at the dirty crack and head for the obvious notch in the headwall. Toproped by Rick White, 1970.
- Juice \* (20) 18m. Use the same start as Keyhole. Later, follow the blocky ledges to an obvious corner. The corner has some really great moves. Toproped by Bernie Corfield, John Jones and Tony Howes, March, 1980.
- Robbie's Robust Runners (16) 18m. Start at Chubba Chips Mods, veer right three meters, then straight up the mank to finish in the chimney. The direct start remains a hotly-contested gem. Led by Rob Stewart, 1985.
- Chubba Chips Mods (18) 18m. Go through the initial bulge with some difficulty, aiming for the crack in the headwall. Toproped by Dave Moss, November, 1984. Led by Dave Moss, December, 1984.
- 32 A (20) 18m. Go right of the tree and up the flake system of the headwall. Toproped by Gordon Bieske and Paul Hoskins, November, 1984. Led by Evan Bieske, Andrew Barry, Gordon Bieske and Dave Moss, January, 1985.
- Zac (19) 18m. Another excellent climb. Track direct to the top wall. Good balance and layback moves up a crack. Getting onto the wall may cause a few problems. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, July, 1980.
- Gynaecology (18) 18m. Deviate as little as possible on your way to the finishing corner/slab. Toproped by Bernie Corfield and John Jones, July, 1980.
- Samson's Pillar (16) 18m. Poor rock around a searing crack. Toproped by John Jones and Bernie Corfield, 1980.
- ? Kellies Route (A1) 18m. Aid climb Samson's Pillar. Aided by Tony Kelly, 1972.
- Wrath Of Grapes (17) 18m. Under the vines lies a great route. Stay with the thin crack. Toproped by John Jones, May, 1980.
- Love Hurts (23) 18m. Gambol up the corner with the rotten left side. TAFE students sometimes use the adjacent airspace for fast descents. Toproped by Andrew Barry, October, 1984. Led by Andrew Barry and Paul Hoskins, October, 1984.
- Surrender \*\* (19) 18m. Pleasant moves on solid rock. Toproped by Andrew Barry and Roger Bourne, September, 1984. Led by Andrew Barry, October, 1984.
- Olos Variant Start (17) 3m. Bridge up the disintegrating corner onto the ledge. Soloed by Andrew Barry, September, 1984.
- The Olos Slab (26) 12m. Climbs the middle of the slab with two glue-ons. Rather than spoil the climb with the unglued final five meters, rap from the belay station. Led by Paul Hoskins, Chris Frost and Andrew Barry, January, 1985.
- Olos Right-Hand Variant \* (19) 18m. Traverse right at three-quarter height. Toproped by Ted Cais, 1970. Led by Tony Young, 1983.
- Olos \* (14) 18m. Via the easy corner to finish. Led by Ted Cais, 1969.
- Snake In The Grass (16) 18m. Interesting on the blank blackness. Take the scoop to complete the outing. Toproped by John Jones, January, 1980.
- Web (17) 18m. Uninspired. Toproped by Rick White, 1969.
- A Bum Full Of Fists \* (17) 16m. Stupendously grope your way to Bieskedom on the prominent arête past the stairs. Led by Evan Bieske, Roger Bourne and Andrew Barry, September, 1984.

Wallbanger (20) 20m. The inept may crater on the start. Led by Andrew Barry, September, 1984.

Fowl Deeds In The Chookhouse \*\*\*\* (23) 19m. The steep wall with tenuous laybacking to start. A definite hyperclassic which ranks with the best on the crag. Toproped by Roger Bourne, September, 1984. Led by Andrew Barry, September, 1984.

Rear Entry \* (21) 20m. The preferred shortcut to the TAFE college toilets. A peg and two bolts protect a low crux. Since there is no belay, traverse right to the fixed chains. Scary to second. Led by Andrew Barry and Robbie Allen, August, 1984.

Endoplasmic Exterminator (14) 20m. Before you get to Gash Flash the cliff turns a corner. Ten meters before this is a filthy, blocky ramble through the choss. Led by Michael Woodrow and Eddie Irvine, December, 1984.

Endoplasmic Exterminator Variant Start (17) 8m. Deceivably chossy. Led by Darren Holloway and Jonathon Dwyer, January 1985.

Gash Flash (17) 11m. Located near the end of the cliff. Well-protected (not groin-straining) bridging up a short, dark-coloured corner. Led by Andrew Barry, Roger Bourne and Evan Bieske, October, 1984.

Gash Flash Variant Start \* (23) 5m. Use advanced buildering techniques to ascend the wall just past Gash Flash, joining Gash Flash, via a traverse move, at the notch on the arête. Soloed by Roger Bourne, December, 1984. The cement pipe, which used to be next to the arête, was eliminated by Evan Bieske, December, 1984.

A Dingo Got My Floater (23) 11m. Instead of linking up with Gash Flash, continue with the arête, avoiding Gash Flash except for runners. Led by Roger Bourne, Evan Bieske and Andrew Barry, December, 1984.

Tode Mode \*\* (25) 11m. The addition of a new hold has made it less intimidating to the bolt. After it is clipped, solve the next problem to stand on slippery lichen, and get a hands-off rest. Prepare for a frolicsome exit. Led by Roger Bourne, January, 1985.

Raped In A Church (23) 11m. Try not to impale yourself on the fence as you do the fingery moves up past two bolts to the Tode Mode ledge. Repeat the frolicsome exit. Led by Michael Woodrow and Jonathon Dwyer, April 1985.

Spack Attack \*\* (22) 14m. Complete a delightful series of moves reminiscent of the top of idiot Wind. A direct finish is still to be led. Toproped by Michael Woodrow and Darren Holloway, April 1985. Led by Michael Woodrow and Jonathon Dwyer, April 1985.

Dazed and Confused (18) 14m. Boulder up the thin crack and pipe hole right of Trash Thrash to a bolt at 4 metres. Somehow clip the bolt and complete the crux to finish up wallowing up the mank. Is this the world's hardest 18? Led by Tony Young and Michael Woodrow, April 1985.

Trash Thrash (14) 14m. Jam and bridge up the filthy corner crack, escaping right at two thirds height. Clean as you climb. Led by Jonathon Dwyer and Mick Woodrow, April 1985.
